If you shoot your handicap on every hole to post a net even par round - congratulations, that's worth 36 points. But shoot the exact same total with 9 birds and 9 bogies - that's worth 63 points. It's not about what you shoot - it's how you shot it.

Play full handicap. Net score on each hole worth points:Doubles or worse = 0Bogies = 1 pointParse = 4 pointsEagles = 8 pointsBirdies = 4 pointsEagles = 8 points

Don't worry if you can't add them all up - that's what computers are for. Your job is to aim for the pin and put those putts in the back of the cup.
